

Carroll hangs on for narrow win in Glens road race

Ballymena Road Club – Northstone – cyclists held their Star Trophy GP of the Glens road race last Wednesday evening at Broughshane. There had been concerns that road works on the circuit would cause disruption but everything worked out perfectly as the re-surfacing in Waterfoot village was completed and the Glenariffe glen road closure was only applicable during the “working day” and the temporary surface on the glen was more than adequate. The weather, however, left a lot to be desired and a torrential downpour caused a twenty minutes delay at the start.

There were fourteen entrants and they went off in three groups with zero, six and eleven minute’s handicaps.

The front group was caught by group two in Waterfoot with just over 20 miles covered. Matthew Brennan was dropped from the scratch group and this left just Simon Taggart, Leo McAllister and Tommy Wilson in pursuit of the leaders. As the riders started their near six miles ascent of Glenariff the scratch trio were 2 minutes 45 seconds behind the front group.

By the top of the glen they had caught everyone with the exception of Mark McCullough and visiting Bann Valley rider Michael Carroll. Mark too was reeled in at Martinstown but veteran Carroll, aboard his new “Cervello” bike, was still ahead and at Rathkenny he still had a 90 seconds advantage. This was down to 26 seconds as the race turned on to Ballygarvey road for the final three miles to the finish.

Tommy Wilson and Simon Taggart had broken clear of the others at Martinstown and they were next on the road and closing the gap with every turn of the pedals but they failed by just two seconds to catch the tiring Carroll who won in 1 hour 43 minutes 40 seconds.

Tommy Wilson finished second and won the Star Trophy as first BRC rider.
